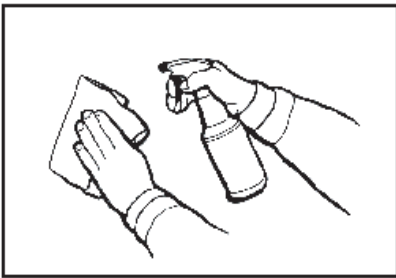
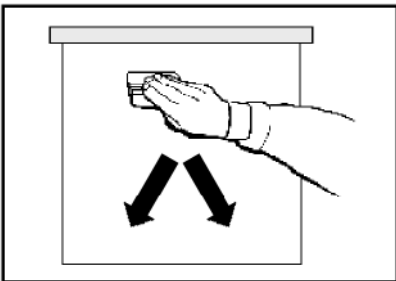


VINYL MURAL APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

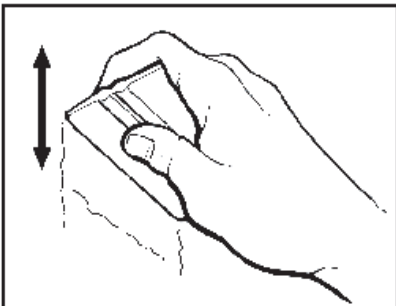
NOTICE: This high quality vinyl mural is not designed to be removed once installed. The mural is backed with a strong self-adhesive. When properly installed using the following technique, removal will be very difficult. Please take your time and plan ahead, confirming the final installation location.



1. Thoroughly clean the surface you're going to apply the vinyl mural to, and make certain it's clean and dry. If the surface has been freshly painted, we highly recommend waiting for the paint to be fully cured before applying the mural to the surface.



2. Your mural has a special protective tape over the printed surface. Gently but firmly rub this tape onto the mural using the supplied squeegee or a credit card to make sure the tape adheres solidly to the entire mural area. It's not necessary to rub this protective tape over the blank areas of the mural.



3. Tape the mural into position using a couple small pieces of masking tape placed along the top edge of the mural, creating a "flap" or "top hinge".
TIP: Using a bubble level and a ruler will assist you in finding the exact location for your vinyl mural.

4. Lift the mural from the bottom, exposing the paper backing. Starting at one corner, very carefully and slowly remove the paper backing from the mural, making sure the mural stays attached to the protective tape. **CAUTION:** Use every effort to avoid letting the adhesive side of the mural touch the surface prematurely.

5. Using a rolling motion, gently let a very small portion of the top of the mural touch the mounting surface. Work outwards and down from the top center of the mural rubbing the mural onto the mounting surface using the squeegee at an angle away from the center. As you work down the mural, keep working from the center outwards and down. Avoid pulling the mural back off of the mounting surface as this will increase your chances of air bubbles in the mural.

6. Once the entire mural has been adhered to the wall, again gently but firmly rub the entire area of the protective tape over mural areas only. This will help to ensure a good bond between the mural and the mounting surface.

7. Carefully remove the protective tape from the mural by slowly pulling it 180 degrees against itself. Carefully re-squeegee all edges after the protective tape is removed to ensure good adhesion and prevent edge lifting.

8. To eliminate air bubbles, puncture the bubble at one end with a pin and press it flat with your thumb, starting at the other end. Always use a pin; never use a knife. A pin hole will close around itself, while a knife cut will open up.
